In the Grade School, we finished our great chapter book, “Eve of the Emperor Penguin”. We ended with the grand finale of having a “Book Share Conference”. This was so special! As a group, we constructed discussion topics about the book that we wanted to discuss (ex. “What is your secret to happiness”, “Why can penguins swim in cold water?”, “Why was this book a good fit book for our class? “If you could take a magic tree house anywhere, where would you go?”) We discussed these all as a group, and it was a magical conference, full of fun, food and great discussions about the book!

The children had so many questions still about penguins, that our next unit of study will be the Ocean (also a topic of study they chose as a class). We are ready to wrap up building and structures, and will be moving right along to this topic next week!

Silly Starters and Math Games

We have been starting our morning in the Grade school room with “Silly Starters”. These are hilarious and have been a great way to warm up for the day. The children use a flip board to choose from possible beginnings, to start a story. It’s so hilarious! They flip a chart to get all sorts of random story starters! Some examples we have written about: “Write a scary story about a library that is upside down!”, “Write about what it would be like to live with a spoon, that was always sad!”, “Create a journal page written by a pet that is invisible”. You can only IMAGINE how funny their stories are. After we free write, we group share, and have a good laugh!

On a different note: We are adding to our repertoire of math games! The children took turns in 2 different groups last week, learning a total of 6 new math games ranging from double-digit subtraction to fact families. We are going to keep adding to our math games!
